In addition to outdoor activities, families and friends can make a meaningful impact and give back by signing up to deliver meals/programs across CRST Reservation, helping to combat food insecurity in one of the largest food deserts in the country. Want to spend the day on the water? Sign up to canoe down the Missouri River on a day long ride! This western adventure is waiting for you.

LEADER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (LDP)

Our Leadership Development Program's (LDP) mission is to empower emerging leaders with the confidence, competence, and compassion needed to thrive as tomorrow's leaders. The program is a structured and immersive experience designed for teenage campers who aspire to become camp counselors or have a desire to become more effective leaders. Our program provides participants with a blend of hands-on training, mentorship, and leadership development.

During the program, LITs engage in various activities and workshops focused on building essential skills such as communication, teamwork, conflict resolution, CPR/first aid certification, and decision–making.

They shadow experienced cabin leaders, assisting them with supervising campers, leading games and activities, and facilitating group discussions/debriefs. Through this apprenticeship model, LDPs gain firsthand experience in working with children and managing group dynamics under the guidance of seasoned mentors. In addition to practical skills, LDPs will receive training in child development, safety protocols, and emergency procedures to ensure they can effectively support campers and maintain a safe environment. By participating in our program, LDPs will have the opportunity to reflect on their experiences, set goals for personal growth, and receive feedback from both peers and mentors.
